MacNider Arts Festival is June 14!

The Charles H. MacNider Art Museum is pleased to announce the theme of the annual MacNider Arts Festival and Outdoor Art Market. This year's "Art is for Everyone" creative art-tastic theme will encourage children to use their imaginations while making exciting projects on Sat., June 14 from 9 am – 5 pm. Arts activities for children, an Art Market full of talented artists, and live music will all be part of the fun. The FREE Pancake Breakfast, served by the City Council, is from 9-10 am or until gone. Basic festival foods such as hamburgers and walking tacos will be sold throughout the afternoon. Proceeds of the food sales benefit the festival and Museum programming.

Kinney-Lindstrom Gallery • May 9 – July 16, 2025



Picturing the Past draws attention to the work of Mason City photographer Safford Lock. The exhibition will highlight Lock's dedication to documenting Mason City, and the Midwest as a whole, through photography. Safford Lock was the owner and operator of Lock Photo in Mason City for more

than thirty years. In that time, his photographs recorded many aspects of life while bringing verve and energy to these sometimes stagnate images. The exhibition will also feature selections from the Museum's photographic collection. These images serve to enforce the view that documentary photography can be both informative and full of life.

2025 marks the 45th anniversary of the Cerro Gordo Photo Show, an annual competitive exhibition that Safford Lock and his wife Lena sponsored from its inception. The Locks wanted to encourage the people of Mason City and Cerro Gordo County to actively document the life and world around them. What a wonderful way to celebrate the art of photography.

Annick Ibsen investigates subject matter through sculpture and printmaking - in that order. She projects her ideas in three dimensions to find the freedom and movement that printmaking offers via juxtaposing and superimposing elements within her compositions. With her 3D works, she aims to expose how sculpture is often a meeting point for art, design, and painting. While sculpture arrests

movement, printmaking allows her to capture forms and line present in the negative space.

Born in Paris, Ibsen settled in Des Moines 20 years ago. She is currently undertaking a Master of Fine Arts at MIU.
